



Call for FRANK Talks Facilitators 2022

Interested in facilitating small group discussions with people across Arizona?

What are FRANK Talks?

[FRANK Talks](#) are free, thought-provoking discussions on important issues facing our communities produced in partnership with Arizona Humanities and the Arizona State Library, Archives & Public Records. The purpose of FRANK Talks is to encourage participants to weigh facts, provide the opportunity to put them in context, and consider different points of view. FRANK Talks inspire people to practice the skills of citizenship—to listen respectfully and engage thoughtfully on issues that affect our communities.

What is the Facilitator's Role?

- FRANK Talks Facilitators lead 60-90 minute virtual and/or in-person discussions with community members co-hosted by local libraries across Arizona. FRANK Talks are discussion-based, *not* lecture format. Facilitators must be comfortable with leading conversations in live and virtual platforms. Programs are typically limited to 25 participants.
- Facilitators must demonstrate expertise on their topics through relevant education/experience. FRANK Talks topics can include education, immigration, democracy, human and civil rights, voting and elections, and more. ***We are especially interested in issues related to the environment and sustainability; journalism and the media; and diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility.*** Topics should be specific rather than general, [see our webpage](#) for current offerings.
- Arizona Humanities is a recipient of federal funds and cannot support programs that advocate specific political, social, or public policy positions. Facilitators must be neutral and unbiased in their presentation of facts and various perspectives.
- New facilitators and topics are added throughout the year. Facilitators must participate in a brief orientation and commit to participating for at least 6 months.
- Facilitators receive a \$250 honorarium per program and reimbursement for travel expenses for in-person programs.
